Kaeja d'Dance Returns to Guelph for Noon-Hour Performance

Guelph, ON (March 13, 2015) – Guelph Dance has a special treat for audiences! Our next CSA Nooner, on Wednesday, April 1, will feature one of Canada's longest-standing contemporary dance companies, Kaeja d'Dance, who are celebrating their 25th anniversary with new works premiering this month.

Allen Kaeja's *.0 (point zero)* is immediate, haunting, and unpredictable. Supporting the impulsive, five dancers propel, distract, interfere and encourage each other's choices in partially set choreography. Karen Kaeja's new quintet – *TAXI* – elicits an enigmatic and provocative take on childhood come adult games of love. What what makes a successful match – choice, timing or some mysterious random pattern of attraction? How do coincidences ignite charged fields of desire, engagement, conflict and hope?

Don't miss this uplifting hour of dance at noon on April 1 in the University Centre Courtyard at the University of Guelph. This event is co-presented with the Central Students' Association and is free to the public.
