Guelph Dance Festival celebrates 15 YEARS!

Guelph, ON (May 7, 2013) – The **Guelph Dance Festival** is proud to present our 15th annual festival from **Thursday May 30** to **Sunday June 2, 2013**. Check out our complete schedule below!

Ticket prices for the 2013 Festival vary by series—with savings of over 15% through advance purchase of a **Festival Pass** (\$70 for 4 shows; **Stage A, B, In the Studio** and **Youth Moves**), **Stage Pass** (\$55 for 3 shows; **Stage A, B** and **In the Studio**) and **Saturday Pass** (\$35 for 2 shows; **Stage B** and **In the Studio**). **In the Park** and **Local Initiatives** performances are pay-what-you can (suggested donation: \$15), and student and seniors' discounts are available (including \$5 eyeGO tickets for students). All tickets at the River Run Centre are reserved seating. After May 25, all ticket prices go up, so be sure to buy your tickets early!
